This contractual service will involve working with an assigned UOG student who will shadow the Master cultural practitioner and engage in language classes, facilitate cultural practices, create, etc.

We are seeking experienced cultural practitioners who are proficient in the CHamoru language and actively engaged in the practice and transmission of traditional cultural knowledge, including skills related to relevant areas such as traditional arts, crafts, ceremonies, music, dance, fishing, weaving, storytelling, etc.

**The contracted service provider will be responsible for providing the UOG Apprentice the following:**

1. Language Expertise:

- Demonstrating fluency in the CHamoru language and the ability to teach or provide language support.
- Developing or delivering language classes, workshops, or immersion programs.

2. Cultural Practices/Skills:

- Facilitating the transmission of traditional knowledge, skills, and practices
- Leading or assisting with cultural activities, ceremonies, and workshops related to specific cultural practice.
- Offering expertise on traditional storytelling, songs, dances, and crafts.

3. Documentation and Reporting:

- Documenting progress on language and cultural initiatives as per the requirements of the contract.
- Providing periodic reports on outcomes, challenges, and recommendations for ongoing initiatives.

**To be considered for this contract, the applicant must demonstrate the following:**

- Proficiency in CHamoru: Demonstrated fluency in the CHamoru language required for the project.
- Cultural Practice Experience: Proven experience as a cultural practitioner with active involvement in the community, including but not limited to traditional arts, ceremonies, storytelling, or other cultural expressions.
